MINUTES OF MEETING – November 2, 2020

The monthly regular meeting of the GMVUAC held virtually via Zoom due to the COVID-19 shut down was called to order by Chair Hiester at approximately 7:04 PM on Monday, November 2, 2020.

Motion: McDonald- Move to approve agenda. Second: Rimbos, Approved – Unanimous.

1. TSD Update-- Val Paganelli (TSD Board Member) (7:08):

- All TSD board members now have mentors, Val's Mentor is TSD High School Junior, Olivia Tamer, and she is attending this meeting.
- 2. Mike Hanson (TSD Superintendent) (7:10):
- TSD Superintendent Mike Hanson and his wife were both raised in Maple Valley and went to Tahoma schools.
- Taught in Port Angeles and Kirkland, moved back to Maple Valley and started teaching at the high school mid-1990's.
- Four of his children attended TSD schools.
- Taught science and served as a Science Coordinator for TSD.
- Was Dean of high school and received his Administrative credentials.
- Was Vice Principal at Glacier Park Elementary School and Principal of Shadow Lake Elementary School.
- March- July worked at interim Superintendent.
- On March 13, 2020 schools were shutdown due to Covid-19 pandemic.
- With in one week there was some support to students- started support/ training for teachers.
- TSD provided ~1,200 laptops by the end of March.
- Initially all school districts in the state were being treated the same regardless of the Covid cases in their counties.

- Now the State provided a "Decision Tree" regarding the pandemic and its impact with a more localized approach by County. It defines high (more than 75 new cases per 100,000), moderate (25-75 new cases per 100,000), and low rates of cases (less than 25 new cases per 100,000).
- Initially TSD decided to do remote learning.
- Thought about going back to in-person learning, but cases have started going back up.
- In order to go back to in-person learning cases have to be low (less than 25 new cases per 100,000).
- TSD board had approved recommendations for modified outdoor athletics, but not with cases as high as they are now.
- Want to improve student experience- big focus on racial equality.
- Met with former/current students of color to hear their experience.
- TSD also is addressing student mental health and wellness concerns- has hired a Wellness Coordinator for the district.
- Tech levy highlights:
 - o There are ~1,500-2,000 Zoom meetings held per day between teachers and students.
 - By spring 2,000 computers had been distributed to students, by fall an additional 3,000 computers were provided.
 - TSD also has provided over 400 hot spots for families who have poor or no internet access.
 - 1,500 calls in the first two weeks for tech support.

• Economy:

- o Economy on edge-increase focus on health and human services.
- Revenue forecast for state and not good, by 2023 there may be a \$8 billion shortfall.
- Will be looking for budget cuts, may make cuts to education.
- There are impacts to the TSD Budget as there has been a reduction of 473 students (e.g., home schoolers, online schools, private schools, delaying starting kindergarten, etc.), which amounts to ~\$5.5M shortfall.
- The discussion was then opened to Questions:
 - Could a new governor force schools to open up if he chose to?
 - Local school boards should ne able to look to public health recommendations.
 - o How has Covid-19 affected college scholarships?
 - Athletics is a small part of scholarships, though some coaches outside of the school district have been trying to put clinics together. Academic scholarships really have not changed.
 - O What have been the impact to teachers?
 - Large stress levels on teachers, as this is a massive change in teaching, teaching
 has become much harder, plus the fear of exposure is real among teachers.
 - McCleary Decision?
 - State Supreme Court ruled the State is required to fully fund basic education. The State Legislature, in response to the ruling, provided a specific amount of funding to be spread out equally throughout the state. Due to this "equalization," some district's taxes went up, some went down. It also limited local levy rates.

- Cedar Hills Comments:
- Last Monday GMVUAC voted to approve the comments. Between Monday and Friday, a lot of comments were changed.
- Normandy Park asked Solid Waste Advisory Committee for GMVUAC to present something to them.
- Letter was to point out issues with assumptions and omissions in the Draft EIS.
- Maple Valley Mayor Sean Kelly would like Rimbos to do a presentation to the Maple Valley Council sometime in January.
- 2. Wagner Erickson Trench Filling:
- Harvey:
- Newly approved permit mid-summer, went ahead with a re-designed project, designated nonsignificant w/o public hearing and approved permit.
- Type 1. Permit- no administrator review.
- King County Superior Court is the only recourse option.
- Harvey is looking at going to ombudsman's office.
- Would like to get GMVUAC support on a letter (a formal complaint) to the King County Ombudsman (Elisabeth Hill).
- Executive Committee could vote on this before next meeting.
